




The Current System




A tool for accountability to ensure we're achieving our goals

Department of Economic Development

- Ultimately responsible for economic development outcomes
- Ombudsperson/buck stopping for businesses whose problems are not getting solved
- Provides overall strategic leadership towards implementation of 2040 goals
- Coordinate with others to ensure programs and policies are consistent with 2040 strategy
- Liaison to state/regional programs; ensure all other economic development tools are up to speed on current state/federal resource opportunities
- Review and advise on UCIDA projects
- Direct and supervise UCEDA programs and staff
- Report to and advise Leg on economic development strategy, including implementation of all tools and resource allocation




A powerful tool to enhance our County's competitiveness

Ulster County Industrial Development Agency and Capital Resource Corp.

- Provides property, mortgage and sales tax exemptions for qualified businesses
- Provides taxable/tax-exempt financing for qualified businesses/organizations
- Through its work, generates revenues to contribute to other economic development activities
- Maintains and updates UTEP/policies to ensure consistency with Ulster 2040 goals

An agile tool that responds at the speed of business

Ulster County Economic Development Alliance

- Administers programs to assist businesses, such as RLF, grant and site assistance, etc.
- Partners with other agencies to respond to emergent needs, such as workforce development, transportation, technical assistance, etc.
- Cultivates community economic development partnerships with local municipalities, chambers, etc.
- Seeks out and develops new funding to support economic development system, e.g. donations, grants, sponsorships, bond financing, etc.
- Accepts surplused public assets and converts them into productive assets for economic development purposes
- Serves as a pass-through for federal funds to reduce regulatory overhead
- UCEDA is able to move at the speed of business, unlike OED. Often businesses can't wait for government process to crank through
