# Resolutions for the December 20, 2016 Session of the Legislature

Chairman Fabiano opted to take Resolution No. 543 out of order.

<u>Resolution No. 543</u>: Establishing Capital Project No. 487 Public Safety Enterprise Software Upgrade And Amending The 2016-2021 Capital Improvement Program And Amending The 2016 Capital Project Fund – Ulster County Sheriff

**Resolution Summary:** This resolution establishes Capital Project No. 487 to upgrade the County's current green screen system implemented in 1993 to New World Public Safety records management/CAD system for 911, the Sheriff's Office Road Patrol, the Civil Division and the Jail. This software upgrade is necessary to transition from a green screen, obsolete system to improve response time and ease of operations for emergency dispatch and records management processes. This resolution requires \$3,000,000.00 of Serial Bonds.

**Discussion:** Lieutenant Perry Soule provided an overview of the program noting this software upgrade is necessary to transition from a green screen - obsolete system to improve response time and ease of operations for emergency dispatch and records management processes. New York State for the last six years has been promising a new records management system would become available – hasn't happened. Chairman Fabiano confirmed there is no state or federal funding available for records management. Legislator Greene supports this resolution and inquired how this upgrade dovetails with the larger radio system upgrade communication system efforts. Lieutenant Soule explained they are two separate projects. This new system is initiated when a 911 call is made and populates all data bases within the department. The program/package is for system upgrades for 911, EMS and fire calls and is available for use by all Ulster County police departments. Legislator Loughran confirmed implementation of software will be completed in 18 to 24 months.

Note: Fire services would be able to participate, but upgrades to their individual radio systems are not part of the program.

Resolution No. 545: Establishing Capital Project No. 488, Installation Of Shoulders Along Route 299, Town Of New Paltz And Gardiner – Transportation Improvement Project (TIP) Not On The State Highway System – Authorizing The Implementation And Funding In The First Instance Of The Federal-Aid And State "Marchiselli" Program-Aid Eligible Costs And Appropriating Funds Therefore – Amending The 2016-2021 Capital Improvement Program – Public Works (Highways And Bridges)

**Resolution Summary**: This resolution establishes Capital Project No. 488 for the shoulder widening and reconstruction on Route 299 (County Routes 7 & 8) from the Wallkill River on Libertyville Road to Route 44/55 in the Towns of New Paltz and Gardiner. A serial bond resolution is required.

Joe Whittaker Field Operations Mgr. Highways & Bridges Department of Public Works noted it covers approximately 5 miles of shoulder widening and reconstruction. Legislator Litts reiterated the need for sub-base reinforcement or the county is just wasting their money.

Resolution No. 547: Establishing Capital Project No. 489 SUNY Ulster – Dewitt Library Roof Replacement – SUNY Ulster County

**Resolution Summary**: This resolution establishes Capital Project No. 489 for replacement of the upper roof for the DeWitt Library, design services and construction work located at the SUNY Ulster Stone Ridge campus. A serial bond resolution is required.

#### Discussion:

Jamie Capuano County Exec. Office provided an overview of the project whereas the insulation has lost its bond from the substrate and is cupping throughout the roof. Because of the insulation failures the roof holds water which is contributing to widespread leaks. Legislator Loughran confirmed the existing roof is at least 20 years old. Legislator Greene asked if any insulation will be added and will the new roof accept the potential addition of solar panels. Jamie Capuano confirmed it will be able to support solar panels and she will inquire as to the status of new/additional insulation. Committee discussion ensued.

The Capital Project cost would be \$250K whereas half would be reimbursable through the NYS Dormitory Authority.

**Resolution Summary**: This resolution supports the application for grant funding for the removal of the Mount Pleasant Bridge in the Town of Shandaken and authorizes any associated grant funding contracts with Catskill Watershed Corporation.

#### **Discussion:**

This resolution supports the application for grant funding for the removal of the Mount Pleasant Bridge in the Town of Shandaken and authorizes any associated grant funding contracts with Catskill Watershed Corporation. Legislator Loughran qualified although the county has nothing to do with this project, the CWC requires legislative support to enter into the application. The CWC has the funding through its Flood Hazard Mitigation Implementation Program (FHMIP). Legislator Greene expressed civil engineer consultants Milone & MacBroom are the leading experts in the field on how to manage flood and storm water, noting this project couldn't do better. Financial impact none.

<u>Resolution No. 551</u>: Establishing Capital Project No. 490 – Purchase Of Mass Transit Buses – Amending The 2016 – 2021 Capital Fund Budget – Ulster County Area Transportation (UCAT)

**Resolution Summary**: This resolution establishes Capital Project No. 490 for the purchase of mass transit buses for the Ulster County Area Transportation (UCAT). The project will replace two existing 30 foot diesel fuel buses with two 30 foot low floor biodiesel buses. One gas cutaway bus to provide senior and disabled transportation services was approved back in April 2016 – Resolution No. 235. A serial bond resolution is required.
