Requesting All State And Federal Officials To Investigate If Refineries, Oil Companies And Distributors Are Price Gouging Customers

WHEREAS, gas and oil prices have reached record all time highs and oil companies are recording all time record billion dollar profits, and

WHEREAS, area gas stations have raised their retail prices two and three times in a single day, and

WHEREAS, many Americans live on fixed incomes and cannot afford the major increases at the gas pump, and

WHEREAS, it is likely that home heating prices will soar in the coming months.

RESOLVED, the Ulster County Legislature requests the New York State and United States Attorney Generals to launch an investigation into the possible price gouging of gas and oil in Ulster County, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, Ulster County urges New York State officials to investigate possible price controls on oil and gas prices in New York State, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Ulster County Legislature shall forward copies of this resolution to President George W. Bush, Governor George E.
